4.0 Matters Arising:

4.1 Ruth Wong:

Urupa Triangle and Maori Land Court Change of Trustee Application

(Page 4-6) Points 9.2, 10.1, 10.2, 10.3 – Ruth provided valued feedback in her investigation regarding ownership of the whenua in order to complete the process of Maori Land Court Trustee appointment. Maori Land Court records show the land ownership is under the Hastings District Council and HRM Crown, with Ngati Poporo as the kaitiaki of the whenua. In light of fact the hapu o Ngati Poporo ki Korongata are being made liable to pay HDC rates.

Whanau in attendance agreed with a query from the floor - “why are we paying the rates when we have no ownership title?” In Ruth’s findings

with the Maori Land Court to discuss ownership and gain clarity with the status of Ngati Poporo whenua, they stated that all communication regarding the whenua is to be conducted with the Hastings District Council, and is not a Maori Land Court issue. This matter has been long-stifled by the fact, Hastings District Council are difficult to engage with, with little or nil justification to hapu of HDC rates charges. Further investigation and conversation with Hastings District Council will continue – on-going.

4.2 Re-Election for Korongata 2B2 Clarification of Laura Keles’ term start and date was brought to the table by the Chairperson, and if re-election for this block be included in today’s proceedings. The process is to state that Laura’s term started as of 07 May with end of term being the Korongata Marae AGM 2019. Laura was elected to replace Kevin Tamati who resigned after being in term for 1.5yrs/3 on Korongata 2B2 block. Robust discussion led to whanau seeking further clarification – the term was agreed to 07 May as Laura’s term start date for a full 3 year term ending ..2019. Why is there need to re-elect? Chairpersons’ justification was given that all Trustees terms be in alignment with the same start date of term, rather than ‘staggered’. This led to further whanau discussion. As Laura’s term was as a trustee replacement in term, that the block she represents be up for re-election today. Whanau were then given opportunity to give their voice to the korero. Aunty Dora Kamau asked Trustees of process in this regard. Ruth Wong clarified due process by reading *AGM Booklet: Korongata Marae Elections – Information about being a trustee and their obligations pages 10-12.*

Whanau in attendance then agreed block Korongata 2B2C be included in today’s proceedings for trustee re-elections.

Laura was then given opportunity to respond to the korero. Laura went on to acknowledge te whanau Hapi for her representation on the block, before proceeding to share whakapapa links to the block. Laura also divulged and reiterated her strengths as a valued Trustee member in matauranga; and Strategic Policies - “ko te pa ko au ko au ko te pa”.

Laura then gave agreeance that Korongata 2B2 be included in today’s proceedings for trustee re-elections.

5.0 Marae Trustee Chair Report – Alayna Watene: Tabled and read (refer to AGM 2017 booklet, pgs 6-7)

Mihi extended to fellow Trustees, Marae committee and whanau for the continued manaakitanga toward their roles & responsibilities with matters pertaining to the marae and whenua o Korongata marae. Alayna acknowledged also the families of those who have passed on, the work of the trustees and the marae committee and all whanau who have supported and helped out over the year. The Strategic Plan is almost there. Plans are in place for a few updates from the Trustees and we will be ready to move forward in alignment with our plan. Heretaunga Taiwhenua was acknowledged for the \$7,000 we receive from them each year. The Te Ture Paewhenua wananga run by the Heretaunga Taiwhenua have also proven valuable with some of our own representatives already feeding back into our marae meetings and strategic planning. A good report was given on the Post Settlement Governance Entity (PSGE) - Heretaunga Tamatea Settlement Trust. Alayna is communicating with them on our behalf, pushing for tangible assets as opposed to cash settlement for our future. For example, land does not lose its value. The idea is to grow the asset not spend it. At the moment the marae has been given its \$100,000 of which Korongata has put three lots of \$30,000 amounts into investment accounts and \$10,000 into the marae account for day to day use. The PSGE has so much going toward hapu growth, regional growth - which means it goes toward the whole community not just to Maori interest, Aorangi Trust Board, Te Aute College, and \$3.2m is spent on operations. Alayna is pushing to find out what the breakdown of costs is, but has received no information back. It was reported that the settlement is strongly weighted to Tamatea rohe. We do need to develop our strategic plan and build on our relationship with Crown and our local community to lift our mana. Mana is better than money. With Te Matatini this year, our marae received 60 mattresses and pillows along with linen to go with it.

Main income is the PSGE \$100,000, Heretaunga Taiwhneua \$7,000, \$10,000 worth of marae bookings and koha for tangi and other community bookings. Outgoings highlighted were general maintenance fees. Consultancy fees, Power and Gas etc.

Ruth Wong is today's Election Officer NB: Ruth Wong cannot participate in the voting process.
- 7.2 Election process: If more than one nomination was received, whānau decided on a reasonable way to vote and agreed on "show of hands" for each nominee; voting eligibility are whanau who whakapapa to the block/s. The candidate with majority of votes by show of hands, is deemed the successful candidate.
- 7.3 Nominations declared open: Whānau had the opportunity to fill in their nomination forms and submit them to the Election Officer.
- 7.4 Nominations declared closed: A call for nominations went out. Nominations were announced closed.
- 7.5 Nominations announced: Each nomination was received and read aloud to allow the whānau of each block to validate the nominee, seconder and candidate.

Firstly on behalf of our Marae Trustees, I would like to thank each and every one of you for your support and for being here today. To my fellow Trustees, thank you for being here also, and for your ongoing support to me as your Chair.

Highlights of the past year

- **Strategic Plan**

Whānau and trustees were involved in the development of our strategic plan which has a myriad of goals and aspirations which we can use to plan and implement activities that will lead to us being once again a self-sustaining, independent community, consistent with tikanga and traditional practices. I have a copy of the plan that I recommend we receive at our AGM today.

- **Heretaunga Tamatea Treaty Settlements**

In March 2018 Korongata Marae Trustees wrote a submission to the Māori Affairs Select Committee, affirming our support for the Heretaunga Tamatea Claims Settlement Bill in order to uphold mana at mana whenua, mana moana, mana tangata o ngā uri o Heretaunga Tamatea. We also registered our concerns that the Heretaunga Tamatea Settlement Trust is not fit for the purpose of receiving settlement. The advice from the Crown was to work from within to effect change and development.

He Toa Takitini was mandated to negotiate the settlement of the historical Treaty claims of Heretaunga Tamatea with the Crown. Heretaunga Tamatea Settlement Trust is the post-settlement governance entity for Heretaunga Tamatea, ratified to receive and manage the settlement redress.

The Settlement is financial and commercial redress of \$100 million including the purchase of Kaweka and Gwavas Crown Forest land with Ahuriri hapū. An additional \$5 million was set aside to support the long-term sustainability of Te Aute College. Statutory Acknowledgements by the Crown of Heretaunga Tamatea special cultural, historical or traditional associate with certain areas of Crown-owned land. Deeds of Recognition require the Crown to consult with Heretaunga Tamatea, and have regard for Heretaunga Tamatea's special association with a site or place and specify Heretaunga Tamatea input into the management of those areas administered by DOC or the Commissioner of Crown Lands.

- **EIT - Catering**

Erina Smith of EIT is running a Marae Cookery Class here at our marae. She currently has 10 students, one of whom is a whanau member from our marae Tui Hapi. This and other opportunities to partner with our community, brings growth and development to our whānau hapū which is very positive.

- **Marae Executive Committee**

I want to acknowledge the Marae Executive Committee for the work they have done to keep the marae grounds and facilities looking beautiful, regardless of the fact that our wharenuī is indefinitely closed, we are pleased nonetheless to be able to come here and meet and feel the wairua of our marae. Over the year we have had a steady flow of bookings and whānau gatherings which has been very positive.

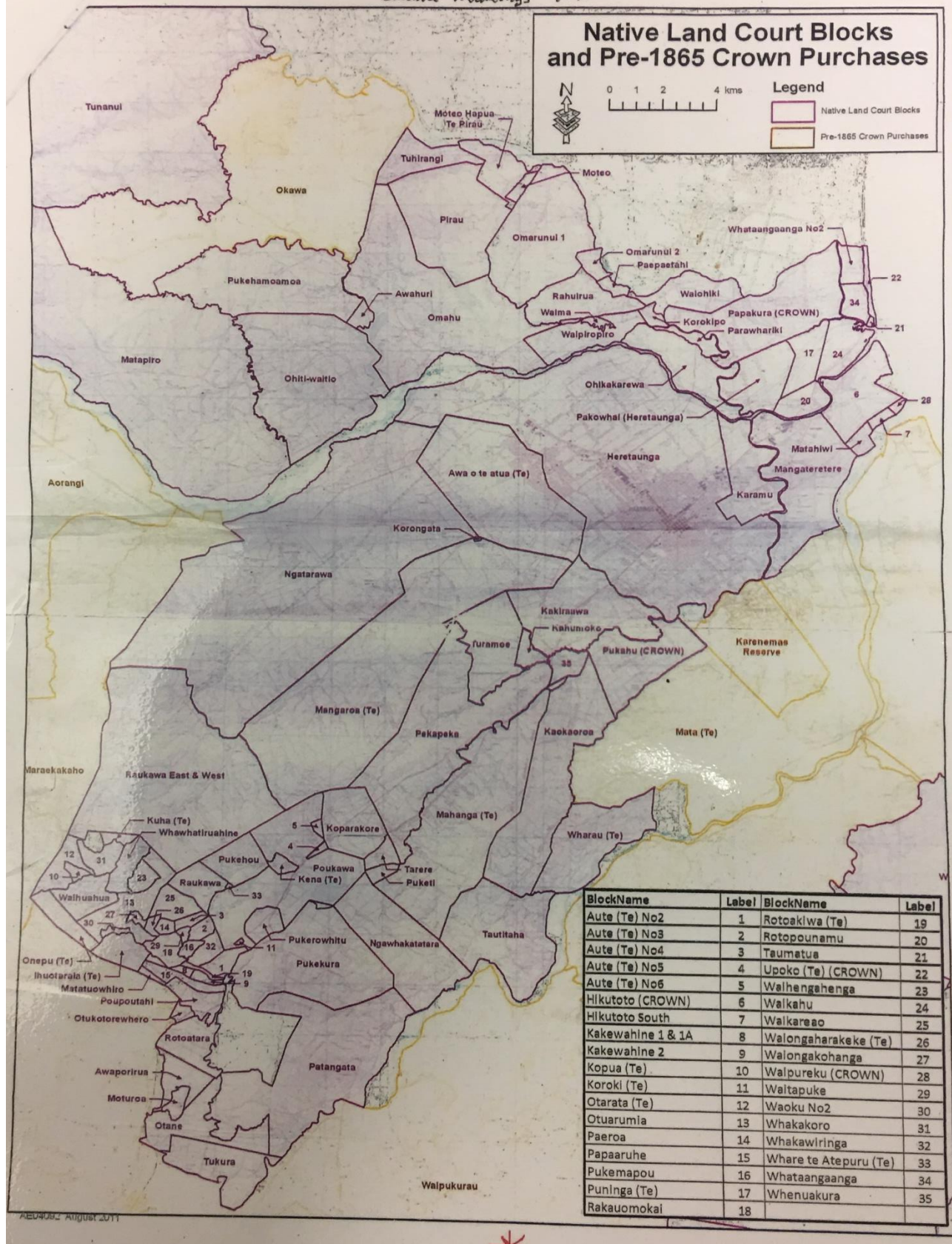
Native Land Court Blocks and Pre-1865 Crown Purchases

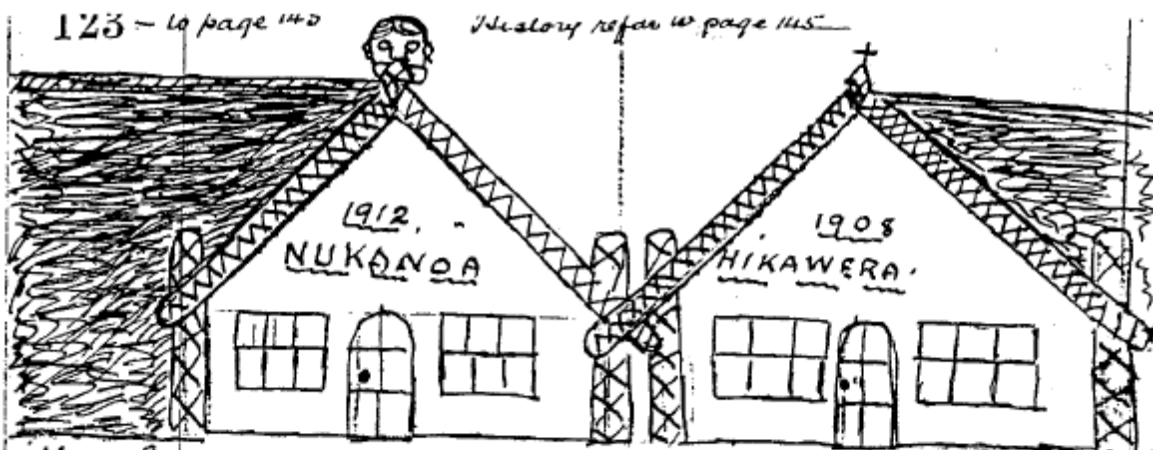
